

Stories of Goltar Water Supply Scheme

Improved lifestyle from 'one house one tap' project....

Pampha Sunar, 35 years old women is one of the beneficiaries of Goltar Water supply improvement scheme of Mahabharat Rural Municipality, ward no 6, Goltar. She live in a small house with her husband who is visually impaired.

Before the project she used to have lots of problem for bathing, washing and to maintain cleanliness especially to her husband, as he is visually impaired. "I used to walk a long distance, around 30 minutes just to fetch water for her husband and I used to help him bath and wash his body with very limited water, but now we have tap in our own house so that husband can go and take bath himself" She added. After the inauguration of tap, she has also maintained cleanliness in her house as she can get enough water in her own house.

We saw Pampha Sunar has dug a pit for the collection of waste water that comes from tap. She use this water for growing vegetables. She said "Now I can save my time that I used to spend to bring water and I can use that time in my vegetable farm". Nowadays she also collects her inorganic waste and garbage in a pit and burn them regularly which she learnt from Public health promotion orientation.

Pampha Sunar is just one of the representatives of 33 household of Goltar WSS. After the one house one tap project at Goltar WSS, people not only are saving their time but also are maintaining cleanliness and sanitation in the community.
